

Correspondences Between Courses Across Curricula – Degree Program C22 Philosophy

(Last update: 07/10/2025)

Students enrolled in previous years who have in their study plan courses that are no longer active may consult this chart to identify the corresponding currently offered exams.

For all courses that have retained the same title, there is a correspondence with the course offered in the a.y. 2025/26. If the system does not allow registration for the exam, it is necessary to contact InformaStudenti.

For all History exams that have retained the same title, students must refer to the courses currently offered within the Philosophy program.

For courses that are no longer offered by the Philosophy program and do not appear in the current educational plan, student must refer to the corresponding course active in other degree programs (for example, Musical Dramaturgy in the Studies in Cultural Heritage program).

It is possible to attend lectures and take exams for all courses that have retained the same title, even if the course catalog lists them as intended for students enrolled in later years.

What to do with lectures and exams:

- Lectures: Attend the currently active course corresponding to the discontinued one.
- Study plan: Keep the title of the discontinued course in your study plan as originally indicated.
- Exams: Register for the exam session corresponding to the discontinued course listed in your study plan.
- If it is not possible to register for the exam of a discontinued course, you must contact InformaStudenti and request the activation of the exam session. Since the procedure takes at least one week, it is strongly recommended to submit the request well in advance.

Example

History of Moral Philosophy corresponds with Foundations of Ethics L–Z, therefore:

- History of Moral Philosophy is kept in the study plan;
- You register for the exam under History of Moral Philosophy;
- If you wish to attend the lectures, you will attend Foundations of Ethics L–Z.
